

## **Sermon Questions for Sunday, June 27, 2021**

### **“It’s a Blessing to Bless Others”**

#### **Psalm 41:1-4; Ephesians 2:4-10**

1. In Psalm 41:1-4, David speaks of blessings we receive when we consider the poor and the afflicted. Describe a time in your life when it was a chore to help another but you later realized it blessed you more than you blessed them?
2. We are saved by \_\_\_\_\_ alone and not from good works. So why do we do good works?
3. How we lead our lives matters. God chose us before the creation of the world for this season for what purpose?
4. List the attributes of God in Ephesians 2:4-10.
5. Further, read Luke 10:25-37, the Parable of the Good Samaritan, to discover what Jesus wants each of us to “go and do likewise.” Consider the characteristics of the Good Samaritan. They should also be true of us. What are the characteristics in your daily life not just on Sundays or on a mission trip? Do you have helping hands that complete the task or just give halfheartedly?
6. So it is not, “What’s in your wallet” but what dwells in your heart. Is your heart transformed? Is your Spirit pumping compassion? Is your love Godly?
7. What does God want you to do with what you have? How does God want you to share your life?
8. In John 14:2, Jesus says, “My Father’s house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you?” What does this Scripture mean to you?
