The Unsung Hero Award

Please join the Board of Deacons in celebrating our latest recipient of the FPCP Unsung Hero Award – Robert Sherby.

Robert was nominated by many individuals within our congregation for his outstanding service to God. Robert is a newer member to our

family of faith having joined FPCP in 2018 but his impact has been felt by almost every person within the church.

From 2019-2022, Robert served this church as a Deacon. He was instrumental in leading the Deacons in planning fellowship events for our church family which included a Board Game night and an outdoor concert – these were two of the very first things we were able to do once our church building reopened.

Throughout the pandemic, when our only option was to worship outdoors, Robert was a faithful member of the tech team which made these outdoor services possible. When we returned indoors, Robert volunteered to be the point person for the development and implementation of our live streaming capabilities for both the Sanctuary and Upper Room services. Not only does this require a great deal of time each Sunday, but also hours of his personal time on weekdays and evenings coordinating with Building and Grounds, the ministers, and staff to ensure we have the proper equipment and connections for high quality live streaming experiences.

Robert has continued to oversee our live streaming ministry every week for the past two years. He rarely misses a Sunday and often only when our ministers insist that he take a break. Our live streaming ministry allows our church family to connect with others in new ways, providing opportunities for those unable to be in church to remain connected, including our dear friends in Malawi.

Robert even managed to figure out how to live stream the outer room services from the parking lot. He now trains our new tech volunteers to help run the live streaming and technical aspects of worship.

Rev. Ashley described Robert last Sunday as, "A man of Spirit, embodying God's creativity and joy along with God's deep desire to build fellowship." We are blessed by Robert and his ministry at FPCP, and for his presence among us, we thank God.
