#### PREPARATION FOR WORSHIP

The service of Tenebrae (the name means 'darkness' or 'shadows') is a Holy Week devotion which traces its roots back to the seventh century. It is characterized by the gradual darkening of the Sanctuary as candles are extinguished throughout the service. Every word spoken in the service is found in the Scriptures.

The service is intended to impress upon us the significance of Jesus' death and the events which led to it. At the end of each 'shadow,' a candle is extinguished followed by a time of silent reflection. The candle representing Christ is not extinguished, but is carried out of the Sanctuary to represent a period of complete silence symbolizing the tomb. Thirty bells will ring to represent the thirty pieces of silver paid to Judas for betraying Jesus. Following the bells the *strepitus* is heard, a noise signifying the earthquake and the closing of the tomb. At the end of the period of silence, the pastor will return the Christ candle to its place in anticipation of the resurrection. The Lord's Prayer will then be whispered in unison. After the Lord's Prayer, the choir will sing one verse and then recess in silence while the congregation waits and then departs in silence.
